State of California Department of Community Services and Development:

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Block Grant is funded by the federal <u>Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS)</u>. Through local governmental and nonprofit organizations, low-income individuals can receive financial assistance for heating or cooling homes, and to have their homes weatherized to make them more energy efficient.

This is accomplished through three programs:

Weatherization Program

Program provides free weatherization services to improve the energy efficiency of homes. Weatherization targets attic insulation, weatherstripping, and minor housing repairs.

Housing Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)
 HEAP provides financial assistance to eligible households to offset the costs of heating and cooling homes. For more information, call 1-800-433-4327 (1-800-433-HEAP).

Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP)
 ECIP provides payments for weather-related or energy-related emergencies.

LIHEAP programs are administered in Santa Clara County by Economic and Social Opportunities, Inc. (ESO). ESO is a primary provider of services to homebound, English as a second language and low-income households. ESO has been the state designated provider of federal low-income energy assistance services for Santa Clara County since 1976. The agency currently administers a number of federal, state and locally funded energy assistance contracts.

ESO will allocate Santa Clara County's share of the California LIHEAP funding for the period June 1 through August 31, 2001:

Additional programs through ESO:

 California Public Utilities Commission funded Electric Education Trust (EET) program

The EET program educates the community on energy program developments. Learning about energy conservation can lead to financial savings. For more information contact ESO (408) 971-2560.

Numerous locally funded Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) programs

Most of the CDBG programs provide funding for low-income communities in Campbell, Milpitas. Mountain View, San Jose and unincorporated areas of Santa Clara County.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E)

Do you need help paying your energy bill? PG&E offers several programs for low and fixed-income customers.

- PG&E Payment Arrangement Line
 - Payment arrangements may include making an upfront "good faith" payment with additional payments due before the next bill. Call 1-800-743-5000.
- Balanced Payment Plan
 - The Balanced Payment Plan helps eliminate big swings in your payments by averaging your energy costs over the year. For more information, call 1-800-743-5000.
- California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) CARE provides income-qualified households with a 15 percent monthly discount on utility bills. For more information call 1-800-743-5000.
- Services for Medical Baseline and Life-Support Customers People who use extra energy to operate life-support equipment or to meet their heating or cooling needs due to a medical condition may be eligible to receive extra Baseline quantities from PG&E. For more information, call 1-800-743-5000.
- Relief for Energy Assistance through Community Help (REACH) REACH is a one-time energy assistance program for low-income customers who experience severe hardships and are unable to pay their energy bill. The program is administered by the Salvation Army. For program eligibility, call the Salvation Army at 1-800-933-9677. To donate to the REACH program, please call 1-800-743-5000.
- Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) LIHEAP is a federally funded program that assists low-income households with paying energy bills. Call 1-800-433-4327.

Rebate Programs

California State Rebate Program

The 20/20 Program provides rebates to customers who reduce their electricity usage. Residential, commercial and industrial customers can earn credit worth 20 percent for each month their electricity use is reduced 20 percent or more.

PG&E 1-2-3 Cashback

Learn about energy efficiency measures that will help you conserve energy and earn rebates or incentives. The 1-2-3 Cashback program offers 1) No cost energy saving tips everyone can do, 2) Low cost home improvement actions, 3) Investments that can be made to save energy.

Convert incadescent bulbs to fluorescent lamps with screw-in bases. Fluorescent lamps can give the same amount of lights as incandescent bulbs, yet use onefourth the amount of energy and last 10 times longer.

Set your thermostat to 78 degrees or more during the summer.

Don't overcool.

Don't turn your thermostat lower that normal to cool your home faster. It doesn't work.

Avoid opening your refrigerator and freezer as much as possible. Opening the doors frequently will make the refrigerator and freezer work harder and use more energy.

Take showers instead of baths, and shorten your shower time. Baths call for 4.5 times as much hot water as showers.

Avoid using large quantities of water during peak times. Plan ahead so that clothes and dishes are washed in the late evening. Water lawns between 10p.m. and 10 a.m.
